THE ROBERTSON SPINNING GROUP



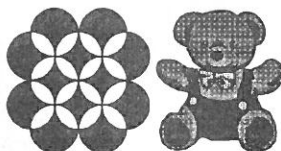

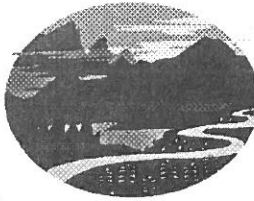

GEOLOGY AT R.E.P.S.

At the next meeting of the Robertson Environmental Protection Society (R.E.P.S.) Dr. Peter Rickwood, from the University of N.S.W. will present an illustrated talk entitled "The Sydney Basin - more than just sandstone and coal!"



Robertson sits on top of part of the southern half of a deep, saucer-shaped deposit of sandstone, formed between around 300 and 230 million years ago. Peter will look at the subsequent volcanic activity, how it affected our part of the Sydney Basin and what the present volcanic situation is.

Geology affects all of us - in the crops we can grow and the type of natural vegetation, the form of the landscape and the mineral and water resources.

Robertson has a number of factors which make it particularly interesting, so do come and learn about the rocks in our backyard!

The meeting will be at 7.30 p.m. on FRIDAY OCTOBER 10, in the Community Centre in Caalong Street.

ROBERTSON NEEDS ASSESSMENT SURVEY

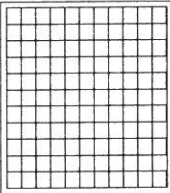

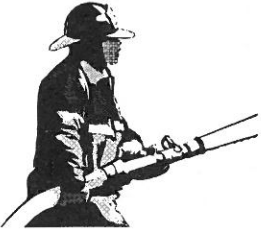

THE ROBERTSON VOLUNTEER FIRE BRIGADE CHECKLIST FOR SPRING

Jim Wilson, Captain of the Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade has some important information regarding the Bush Fire Season. Did you know that as from September 1, you now need a permit to burn? The good news is, the permits do not cost anything and they can be obtained from Jim Wilson at Wilson's Butchery. But each time you burn a new permit needs to be obtained, and if a total fire ban is in place then they become obsolete. Burning is restricted to the hours of 7.00 p.m. in the evening and 7.00 a.m. the following morning.

As we're coming back into summer again, now is the time to think about preparing your home for Bush Fires. This check list will be handy.

- * Clear dry timber, vegetation and rubbish well away from the house
- * Keep the grass around the house short and green
- * Clear a fuelbreak between your property and any adjoining bush
- * Clear undergrowth from fences
- * Remove any branches overhanging the roof of your house
- * Keep gutters clear of leaves, bark and twigs
- * Connect hoses that will reach all corners of your house
- * Store flammable liquids well away from the house
- * Close open eaves and the space under your house
- * Fit wire screens to windows, doors and vents
- * Display emergency numbers where you can clearly see them
- * Form an emergency fire plan with your family
