Taking place over two days from May 6 - 7 at the Robertson Showground in the heart of the Southern Highlands, this event promises to be bigger, better & potato-ee-yeer than last year with



lashings of entertainment in the form of even more music, competitions and food options than last year!

Festival organiser Gary Fitz-Roy says, "Last year's event had so many things that didn't go to plan, namely the weather, but overall it was still a great success. This year we are looking to build on the great foundation we laid last year by introducing new experiences, like the helicopter rides and animal petting farmyard, and expanding the number of

competitions, activities, food trucks and entertainment & music options."

Fitz-Roy also commented, "The nationwide shortage of potatoes recently has highlighted how much we love the humble potato and how it really is a staple in our lives. The **Spud-a-Dome** will be hosting a feast of events and competitions over the weekend including mash eating competitions, peeling, stacking and picking events. There will also be rides available for all the 'small fries' as well as free face painting and an animal petting and feeding farmyard. For those wanting a bird's eye view of the spud-tacular event, scenic helicopter rides will be running allowing attendees to take in the potato fields and picturesque scenery from a different angle.

There will be displays of Old Farm Machinery with working engines and a classic vintage car show & shine that are sure to a-peel. New extended classes including wooden spoon making and mead brewing make up additional activities visitors can book and take part in.

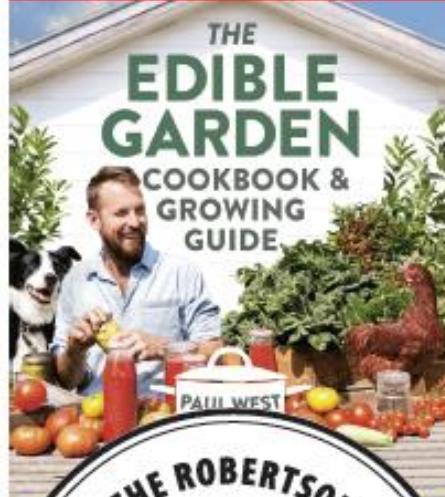

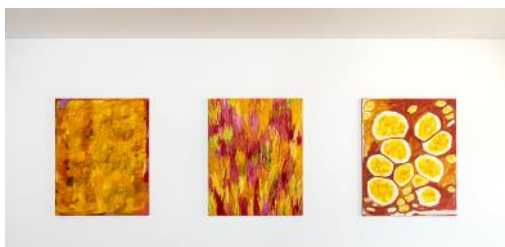
Take a Tour of the Highlands Hive!

Highlands Hive visitors often feel they are discovering secret treasures amongst the labyrinth of laneways and passageways. The old potato shed was built in the Sixties and added to in the Seventies. It has been home to everything from shops and art studios to the interior of the Hoggett farmhouse in the blockbuster movie, *Babe*. The reimagined Highlands Hive is home to plants and flowers, cooking, art, retro and antiques, homewares, jewellery, massage, coffee and cakes. Artist Dr Bronwyn Berman is also a yoga teacher and has just started teaching classes onsite as well.

Jennings Kerr doubled its gallery size last month after just 18 months of operation. Exhibiting artists include Gary Christian, Imbi Davidson, Harriet Goodall and Bonnie Porter Greene. The gallery will present A

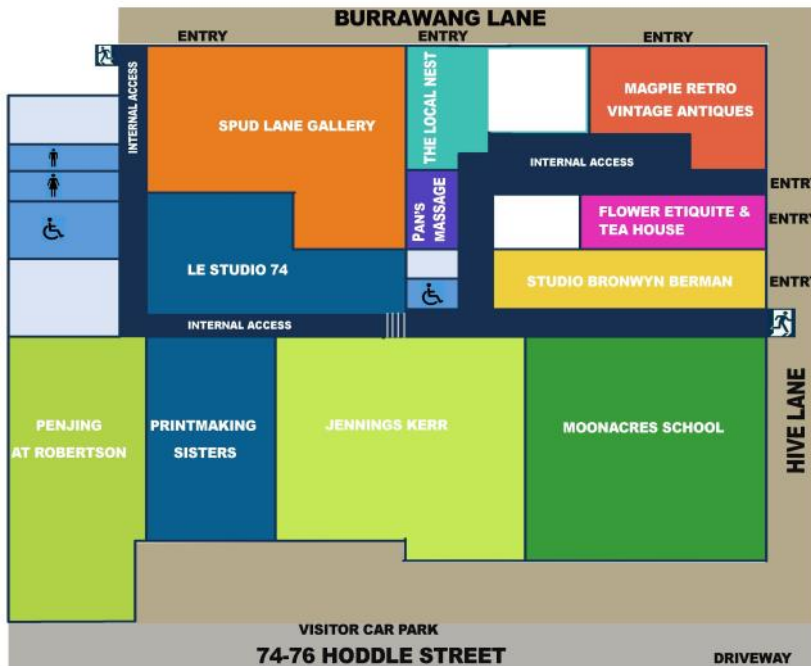

Talking turtles – next REPS talk

Patrick Tegart is the Biodiversity Projects and Community Education Officer at Wingecarribee Shire Council and on **Friday 14 April at 7.30pm at**



the CTC he will be giving a talk on freshwater turtles. Patrick joined Council after working as a citizen science scientist at the Office of Environment and Heritage (now Department of Planning and Environment).

Since joining Council, he has been involved in a range of projects that support our local biodiversity, including platypus, koalas, glossy black cockatoos and freshwater turtles.

Working with freshwater turtles has been one of the newer projects and species that he has been involved in. The work stemmed from a community enquiry about Lake Alexandra turtles. Timing sometimes is everything, and fortunately in this instance the enquiry came about around the same time the national 1 Million Turtles Community Conservation Project began. He will talk about this and the project during the presentation.

The presentation will cover information about:

- Freshwater turtles.
- The 1 Million Turtles Community Conservation Project.
- Becoming a citizen scientist and using the TurtleSAT app.
- What to do if you come across a turtle crossing the road.
- Turtle related work that has been happening at Lake Alexandra.

Community Composting!!

Did you know that when our food waste goes off to landfill it produces methane, which is a powerful greenhouse gas? And did you know Australians waste 7.6 million tons of food each year, much of it trucked off to landfill. It's amazing but that is how much food is wasted every year from paddock to plate by us Aussies. It's a lot.

Maybe we can do our part to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by collecting our food scraps and putting them in a community composter. These big composters can take food waste that you can't compost at home, like meat, bones, dairy, compostable food containers, etc. They can also take weeds and other green waste from your garden. We have so many food service outlets in our town, and a lot of that waste goes off to landfill too! Even if you already compost at home, this could be a great thing for our community, reducing our emissions and providing beautiful enrichment for your garden.

Near Me NSW was updated to include additional information about other emergencies from the NSW State Emergency Service. Fires Near Me is now called **Hazards Near Me**. Over time, more alert types and functions will be added to the app. If you already have the Fires Near Me app on your device,

download the update in your app store. You can find current information about local emergencies on Hazards Near Me. The app shows information provided from emergency services on: bush fires, floods and advice on what to do to stay safe. The app also provides other warnings and activities in your area: fire danger ratings, total fire bans and hazard reduction activities. The app can send you push notifications when there are new incidents or when information changes.

Glossies in the Mist Tree Planting

As part of the Glossies in the Mist landscape



recovery project Saving our Species we aims to build connections for Glossy Black Cockatoos throughout the Southern Highlands.

We are planting feed trees and future nest trees for Glossy Blacks in conjunction with koala feed trees. These plantings bolster a series of five habitat corridors we have been working on for the last year that stretch from Canyonleigh to Barrengarry.

Our April 4th planting is on a lovely property adjacent to the National Park, and forms the midpoint of the Robertson – Barrengarry corridor. We will bring back those food resources missing from that area to encourage our threatened Glossy Blacks to persist in the landscape. The grounds are relatively flat and easy to plant on, and if anyone would like to join us they can email me to register for the event.

All welcome to plant trees ahead of Earth Day, and before Autumn planting finishes in late April. Other

dates and locations are Thu 6th April in Sutton Forest and Tue 11th April in Canyonleigh. What a great way to connect with like-minded people and do some good for our beautiful Glossy Blacks.

What's Happening at the CTC

ARTISTS INVITED TO CAPTURE THEIR REFLECTIONS ON ROBERTSON FOR ART PRIZE

CTC Robertson is once again hosting an annual Robertson Art Prize and artists from across the region are invited to enter works within the theme of "Reflections on Robertson". The Robertson Art Prize will be held in conjunction with the Robertson Potato Festival, which is from 6 – 7 May 2023.

This year, there will be an Open Category, for artwork in any medium. Robertson businesses are sponsoring the winner's prize, which includes \$500 cash prize donated by Highlands Hive and \$200 in framing services from the Custom Picture Framing Shop.
