## The Urgent Issues

For years, the NSW government has failed to address pressing issues, leaving our school community to operate in deteriorating conditions. Robertson Public School, which has proudly served the community for over a century, is now in urgent need of maintenance and development. Here are some of the critical issues we face:

**Stormwater and Downpipe Repairs:** Frequent rainfall causes water damage due to inadequate drainage.

**Replacement of Old Galvanized Water Pipes:** These outdated pipes need to be replaced to ensure safe drinking water.

**Inadequate Bathroom Facilities:** Our bathrooms require urgent repair to meet basic hygiene standards.

**Accessibility for Students with Disabilities:** We must ensure that our school is inclusive and accessible to all students.

**Improved Lighting in Classrooms and Workspaces:** Proper lighting is essential for a conducive learning environment.

**Fixing Trip Hazards Around Toilets:** Safety hazards must be addressed to prevent accidents.

**Roof Replacements:** Many areas of the school have leaking roofs that need immediate attention.

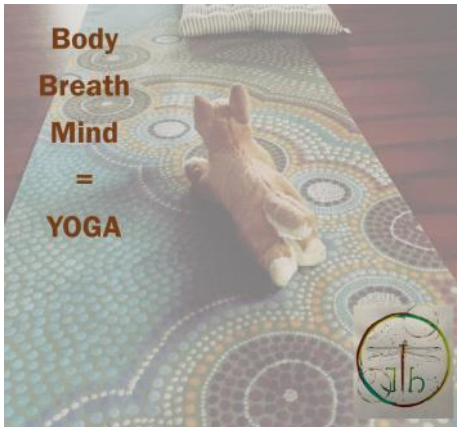


# What is yoga?

I can honestly credit yoga with my own personal transformation. My mother took me to yoga at a young age to help me overcome insomnia. And I promptly fell asleep during savasana! I have practiced yoga ever since and in 2017 I decided it was time for me to become a teacher. A major injury led me to believe I would never reach my dream. But I got there! I recovered, from the pain, the loss of hope and became a registered yoga teacher. I now teach yoga classes across the Highlands. Following that one dream, led to admitting other dreams and following them too.

So what is yoga? I am often asked if yoga is a religion. The simple answer is no, absolutely not. It is a science developed over thousands of years. The most commonly practiced part of yoga is asana or the poses and exercises. The other question I



hear is do I have to be flexible? Again no, but you will gain flexibility over time by practising yoga. You will also gain strength and a connection to your breath. Breath awareness helps us perform exercises in a way that we gain maximum benefit but minimise injury. Breath work can also reduce anxiety and increase energy. There are many types of yoga, flow, vinyasa, hot yoga, Iyengar. I teach Hatha which is a very traditional form of yoga, practiced at a slower pace, with focus on the breath, controlled movements, and stretching. It can be practiced on its own as a form of gentle exercise or to support other exercise such as swimming, running or team sports.

Yoga should also have an emphasis on posture, on

counteracting the effect of sitting hunched over a computer, steering wheel or sewing machine all day. And it can be adjusted to every ability, practiced standing, lying or sitting on a chair. Yoga is always about moving in the best way for you, right now and not what the teacher can do. Yoga is a beautiful practice with many benefits.

So if you'd like to try yoga, what do you do? Be curious, try different styles of yoga and different teachers to find one, or many that suit you. Approach the practice with a sense of lightness, fun and again curiosity.

# Are you keen to know if any nocturnal wildlife are visiting your bushland?

Update from Wingecarribee Shire Council

The Southern Highlands Koala Conservation Project is offering eligible properties in Kangaloon, East Kangaloon and Glenquarry **free** thermal drone surveys to search for koalas and other nocturnal wildlife to better understand how these animals are using remnant bushland in the area.

We have more than 3,000 koalas in the Wingecarribee Shire, and years of monitoring in the nearby Upper Nepean State Conservation Area (the Water Catchment) has revealed a high-density, thriving koala population. Koalas from this population occasionally venture into surrounding private properties and have been seen crossing Tourist Road, Rowlands Road, Kirkland Road and

Kangaloon Road.

No systematic surveys have taken place to understand how these koalas are using the fragmented habitat on private land through Kangaloon and surrounding localities, since an initial koala tracking survey in 2015. The fertile soils and high rainfall in Kangaloon result in high quality koala habitat which can support more koalas per hectare than bushland further west in our Shire.

We want to know if koalas are using these high quality but small patches of bushland outside of the water catchment in Kangaloon, East Kangaloon and Glenquarry.

We need your help to answer this question, even if you have never seen a koala on your property. Koalas are notoriously hard to find but thermal drones are an exciting new method that makes finding koalas, and other wildlife, much easier (and quicker!).

**Survey dates:** From 8 July – 12 July 2024, starting between 6 - 9pm.

**Eligibility criteria:** Your property must have a patch of Eucalypt bushland that is at least 1 hectare (or 2.5 acres) or have bushland that connects directly to bushland on neighbouring properties totalling more than 1 hectare.

If we receive more registrations than can be serviced in this project, we will prioritise properties for drone flights based on the area of koala habitat.

The project is funded by the NSW Government Koala Strategy.

# Update from Robertson RFS

The Bush Fire Danger Period (BFDP) ended on 31 March 2024 but there are still regulations to follow if you want to do a hazard reduction burn.

Check if backyard burning is allowed on your property via Council's interactive 'backyard burning policy map' - [www.wsc.nsw.gov.au/Environment/Pollution/backyard-burning-steps](http://www.wsc.nsw.gov.au/Environment/Pollution/backyard-burning-steps)

Check what you can burn and other regulations such as burn pile sizes

Notify RFS and your neighbours [www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/notify](http://www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/notify)

On your chosen day check weather conditions and make sure you are prepared to control the fire.

Superintendent Daniel Osborne of the Wingecarribee and Wollondilly RFS District says "Even though a fire permit is no longer required from the RFS, residents must still notify their neighbours and the RFS 24 hours before burning by logging on the RFS website.

"Before lighting up, people should also have sufficient equipment on hand to control and contain the fire to their property and call Triple Zero (000) immediately should the fire escape their property. "There is always the potential for fires to threaten

life, property and the environment, if they are not managed correctly."

Superintendent Osborne said the local community should not become complacent to the danger of bush and grass fires, even during autumn and winter months.

"Local fire danger ratings will continue to be issued daily, giving the community an indication of their fire risk year-round," Superintendent Osborne said.

"I urge all residents to take the threat of bush fire seriously and to prepare their families and home now. The first thing you should do though is update your Bush Fire Survival Plan and discuss it with your household."



And with winter now upon us, before you light up your fireplace, please check your flue! A blocked flue can cause a fire in your chimney, roof cavity or send embers out the top.

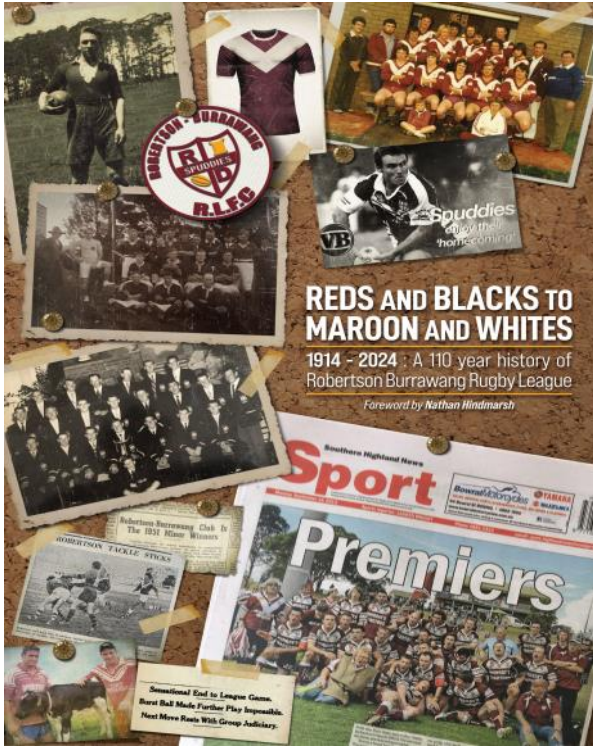

## Local Government Elections

Wingecarribee Shire Council currently has a State appointed Administrator, Mr Viv May PSM. Following a Public Inquiry, on 14 July 2022 the Minister for Local Government dismissed all Councillors, and this followed their suspension since 12 March 2021.

## Red Cross Services for checking in

The Australian Red Cross offers two services for friendship and support—**Telecross** and **Telechat**.



Telecross provides a daily morning telephone call to check on the wellbeing of people who are lonely and or at risk of an accident or illness that may go unnoticed, such as falling and being unable to call for help. The calls are made by trained Staff and

Volunteers, 365 days per year, and provide reassurance as well as help to maintain independence.

Telecross is also available to the carers of people who are eligible for the service. When family and carers are away, or if someone has just returned home after a hospital stay, Telecross can also be

used on a temporary basis.

TeleCHAT provides a regular telephone call to people who would benefit from a social chat once a week.

Sometimes it can be difficult for people to get out to social activities and living alone means they might not always have someone to talk to. TeleCHAT provides a connection to the community.

These social support programs are funded through the Commonwealth Home Support Program and are available nationally **through MyAged Care referrals**.
