Vale Jack Skipper Community MC 23 Apr 1930-24

Jack Harold Skipper died on 24 August following an extended illness. He and his wife. Lvnette, were members and valued supporters of REPS for many years. Their farm in the Robertson district was a source of keen interest and a joy.



Jack saw active service in Korea (where he was awarded the Military Cross), Malaya and Maralinga.

Lieutenant Jack Skipper was posted to the Korean War with 1RAR for 12 months after graduating from the Royal Military College, Duntroon. He earned his Military Cross for "courage and devotion to duty" while commanding a fighting patrol that engaged with the enemy three times in no-man's land in 1952. After serving in Korea, Jack returned to Haramura Battle School in Kure, Japan, as an instructor.

Mr Skipper was a well known and highly regarded member of the Robertson community. Sincere condolences are offered to his wife Lynette.

Invitation to Write Your Story conted from p1

Over the course of 6 weekly sessions commencing Sunday 22 October 2-4pm, we will brainstorm and develop ideas for your story and how to apply writing techniques to create a work that can be read and enjoyed by others. Through talks, readings and discussion, we will look at things like setting, character and tone to turn your idea into the best piece of writing that it can be.

You will be taught and led by Robertson writer and UTS research student Atul Joshi within a non-judgmental and supportive workshop environment that enables you to share your work with fellow participants and learn from each other. Along the way, we'll have guests joining us, such as local writer Kylie Needham, Goulburn writer Nigel Featherstone and Wollongong writer Jackie Bailey. They will all use their own published work to show you how they have used common writing techniques.

The program of six two-hour sessions costs \$25 (\$20 Concession) and you will be supplied with a full reading kit, course notes and outline. If you don't have a computer, access to the CTC's computers is possible or you can use a notebook and pen. You will need to commit to a program of

readings and writing assignments that should take up 2-3 hours of your own time a week. The program is suited to participants 18 years old plus — places will be limited so everyone can receive individual time and attention. Atul will be available outside of the weekly sessions to provide ongoing advice and mentorship. The course will culminate in a final showcase where you will have the opportunity to read your work to fellow students and invited family and friends. With your agreement, your work will then be published on the CTC Robertson website as a living archive.





A Message from New Minister Dan Bidwell

Dear new neighbours and friends,

Jo and I have received such a warm welcome from the Robertson community since we arrived here in June. On moving day, we were greeted with a fruit basket and delicious pizza from Pizzas in the Mist. A church member delivered a trailer full of firewood. Since then we have been the recipients of many offers of hospitality in Robertson, Kangaloon, Bundanoon and Bowral. We've also been grateful for the advice and reassurance we needed as new 'farmers', if owning four chickens counts as farming! Our family embarked on an adventure to the US in 2019 after Charlotte finished her HSC. Fern Talk

The next REPS talk will be held at the AGM on Friday 10 November 2023 7.30pm at CTC Robertson when Dr Kevin Mills will speak about the ferns of the South Coast as detailed in his recently released book. Kevin is a botanist and ecologist who has lived in the Illawarra district for more than 40 years. His vast experience includes work on several botanical projects in the region and his detailed knowledge of the flora has been gained through extensive field surveys across some of the South Coasts most remote areas.

He has also been conducting more surveys of the Robertson highlands and has added several species to the fern lists for the region and the state.

Kevin has authored or co-authored several books on native plant species and has systematically investigated the fern flora occurring on the NSW South Coast – a 12 year project which culminated in the production of his latest book.

He has also somehow managed to find time to conduct landmark studies on the vegetation of Norfolk Island and nearby Philip Island.

Closer to home, Kevin is closely involved with the rehabilitation of habitat on The Five Islands off Port Kembla and the regeneration of rainforest at Minnamurra Rainforest Centre in Budderoo National Park. He has been a volunteer for the NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service for more than thirteen years as a member of the South Coast Regional Advisory Committee.

Memory Improvement Course

Many people would like a better memory, especially as we age. You don't have a fixed amount of memory from birth which is unchangeable. You can upgrade your memory! There are techniques for remembering which can be practiced and learned to make life easier. Recent research on the plasticity of the brain shows that our brains adapt to new situations. Brains have an almost infinite number of neurons for our memories to use. This means that memory does not have to decline with age. The fact that people believe this is one of the things which limits remembering. Talking to our brains as if they are defective is not helpful. It would be like telling a child that they can't read or write. But that is not the end of the story. Tried and true memory skills and methods go a long way back in history.

Learning new memory skills can be creative and playful. Whether it is propping up your memory with new tools, assisting study, lessening frustration and embarrassment you can do it. It is reassuring to know you can rely on your memory.

In this *Memory Improvement Course* in Robertson you will learn about your memory now and what is possible when you use the tools provided. You practice those skills during the course. The course covers-names and faces, tips which work for experts, using mind maps, song and story for memory. And learning to forget things you don't want to remember. This is not a "school kind of course" it is adult learning by doing.



Heritage Study Exhibition Wingecarribee Council, in

partnership with local volunteer heritage and history specialists, embarked on a project in late 2020 to examine previously identified potential heritage places and to identify previously unidentified places of value to the community. This project culminated in the Wingecarribee Community Heritage Study 2021-23 which examined more than 600 potential places of heritage significance and recommends the protection of nearly 480 places that contribute to our cultural heritage and understanding of our area's history. Some of these places are located within Robertson. In addition to individual items, the Study also recommends 8 new heritage conservation areas, and 6 extensions to existing heritage conservation areas throughout the Shire.

The Study responds to the community's vision and goals that acknowledge and value our heritage that are articulated through the Wingecarribee Community Strategic Plan, Wingecarribee 2041.

Council is currently inviting consultation with owners of places identified as having heritage significance who have received a letter. Council will shortly be writing to owners of places within proposed heritage conservation areas for consultation with them ahead of **public exhibition which commences on 3 October 2023.**

Have Your Say on Council's Integrated Transport Strategy

Council has committed to developing an Integrated Transport Strategy for the Shire, to guide transport planning and decision-making over the coming 20 years. The Strategy will give effect to specific actions outlined in both the Wingecarribee Community Strategic Plan and the Local Strategic Planning Statement which seek to improve transport infrastructure throughout the Shire, create walking and cycling friendly communities and encourage the use of public transport.
