Belmore Falls Road Action Group

Sealing the Missing Link

We would like to inform the Robertson community of our push for the sealing of the "missing link" on one of the district's most beautiful roads - Belmore Falls Road, Robertson. It is very important that the 700 metre dirt stretch between the early sealed sections immediately south of Robertson regains priority listing during the Council's annual budget process which begins in March.


Our high rainfall, almost double that of the Shire's other major dirt roads, means surface and structural deterioration, erosion and wash-off of sediment into the Kangaroo Creek, not to mention our perennial and often dangerous potholes. When its not wet, dust clouds from people and paddocks make driving on this scenic route unpleasant for tourists, residents and business people. The level of maintenance is very high.

The Belmore Falls Road Action Group has been seeking the sealing of this road for nearly ten years; we have achieved the grand total of 3.3 km (out of 13 km) bit by bit, starting from Robertson and snailing south. Last year we were unexpectedly demoted from the Priority List, so nothing more happened. We need the support of councilors to ensure the 'missing link" at least is restored to the Priority List for 1999/2000 funding. We thank our community for the support it has made evident during the long haul.

THE RVA: By Mick Wren, President

The Robertson Village association is involved with many issues affecting our community. One of these involves transport in Robertson. Yesterday when I called Kiama coach-lines, I was informed that they did not run a service to Robertson. They indeed thought that they ran a connecting service from Moss Vale to Wollongong only for Countrylink passengers. This is not the case. I rang the office of the local member, Bob Harrison, who rang Countrylink. They informed his office that Robertson was exempt and was to be treated as a Cityrail station. However, Robertson passengers will be removed if Countrylink passengers have booked scats. There are other anomalies. The bus service replaced the rail service, yet there are no bus stops at Mt Murray, Ocean View or St Andrews where there were previous services. Burrawang, although having a bus stop, officially cannot catch the Countrylink service unless a connecting. rail ticket is purchased as well. Further, Countrylink seems to be unaware that Kiama coach-lines runs this service, referring us instead to Berima coach-lines, and we have been told that residents have not been charged uniform fares for trips into Burrawang. This seems very unfair and it also appears that their promise to maintain a bus service at a similar level to the rail service has been broken. It is something we will be pursuing as an association. We are still pursuing the footpath issue for Fountaindale Rd. to Robertson and Caalong Streets and we are concerned about some of the reports we are receiving from residents who have tried to deal with council on the sewerage issue. These issues are also being pursued and we will be trying to clarify the councils actions in response to the public meetings held earlier this year. We are involved in clean-up Australia day. In conjunction with REPS, we will be cleaning outside the Robertson Public School in Warranga street. REPS will be do the Robertson rail station, whilst we do the approaching road. All we require is a few hours

A feature of Friday's show will be the heavy horse competition.


